Mission Africa goes from strength to strength

We are now at a very exciting time in Mission Africa's history with expansion occurring in all three areas of ministry. Barely a month passes now without one or more mission or leadership training events occurring in more and more countries. All beyond our wildest dreams when we had our first mission in 2000!



From an evangelistic point of view alone we are currently involved in **eight** missions or follow up visits a year to remote villages within Uganda itself. All of these are now being headed up by one of the very experienced and anointed Ugandan pastors in our Evangelistic team. These are overseen and directed locally within Africa by Pastor Steven Trint (*left*) in collaboration via e-mail and SKYPE calls with myself here in Jersey.

Many souls won!

Our committed team frequently endure indifferent sleeping and food arrangements when visiting these remote rural areas. In addition, there is much spiritual opposition in such places where the majority of people visit witchdoctors. Despite this the team have seen over 440 people (including many Muslims) come to Jesus in just the first few months of this year alone (we are believing for many more in the remaining months). In addition there have been very many wonderful healings and deliverances.

Shortly after I arrive I will have the pleasure of meeting up for a few days with the Mission Africa Evangelistic Team at the Focus Retreat centre near Lake Victoria to review the missions held so far this year, to pray, have fellowship and make plans for 2012.

Following this Steve and I will be visiting a number of areas in Uganda where Mission Africa has both held very fruitful missions and built churches. We will also going to places where Mission Africa has been able to purchase cows and pigs for poor families. Also land for cooperative farming and the funding of micro-businesses to help alleviate malnutrition and poverty.

(Note: Whilst we in the West are being squeezed financially, our brothers and sisters in Uganda are having an even harder time due to rapidly rising food prices (inflation is $16^{\%}$). Apart from other things, this is making it particularly difficult for the pastors we know to feed their pupils at the schools they run.)
