Malawi and Tanzania

By God's grace our work has extended way beyond anything we could have imagined when we set out thirteen years ago. We are now reaching out from our home base in Uganda to encompass Rwanda, Kenya, Tanzania, Burundi, Congo, Malawi and even expatriate African communities in Qatar! We are so grateful to the Lord and to you!

Separately and in company with their African colleagues, our colleagues *David Ballard* and *David Tucker* have recently visited Malawi and Tanzania. They had long and difficult journeys to remote areas in both countries, but they discovered a huge hunger for the teaching that they brought. One of the pastors in Malawi has already taken the teaching he received into Mozambique, so the work is continuing to spread, just as Paul was clearly experiencing in the early church in the verses quoted above.

Mission to Nakaseke (9th - 15th September)



Our journey in Mission Africa started thirteen years ago at a school and orphanage in *Butajunja* an area in the middle of the bush seven miles from the small township of *Nakaseke*. This is where we are returning thirteen years later on the 9th September to conduct a weeklong mission. In the meantime we have had the joy of seeing many tens of thousands come to Christ in in all these countries.

Pastor Daniel Kato, (who was still at school on our first trip in 2000 will be leading this mission. After graduating from university he

worked for five years as the

administrator of a Christian Secondary School in *Nakaseke*. He launched out as a full time evangelist at the beginning of

this year and has been continuing to study theology in between all his mission work.

Nakaseke suffered hugely in the civil war that broke out after President Amin's departure. Some of the buildings wrecked during those terrible years have still to be repaired. Mass graves can still be seen with the bones of those slaughtered.

We would be most grateful if you could take these challenges seriously and turn them into prayer!

* Witchcraft: The chairman of the local council has a large shrine next to his house. Business people regularly use witchcraft both to protect themselves and sabotage others.

* Alcoholism is rife in this region. Many unemployed men can be seen sitting under trees drinking potent local brew (waragi).

* Incidents of sexual crimes and assault are on the increase.

* There has been a history of **backsliding** after previous crusades that other organisations have held in this region.

* The pastors acknowledge that there is little unity amongst them. Mission Africa will be working with a team of thirteen local pastors led by our colleague *Pastor Fred Mudde*.

* False prophets are on the rise. This is bringing confusion to the people.

* Jesus said that a prophet has no respect in his home area! Although living in Nakaseke, Daniel Kato is the Assistant pastor of a church in Kampala. This could potentially cause problems in terms of leading and organising the pastors. This is a real concern to Daniel. May no one look down on him for his age or experience (1 Tim. 4:12).

- Salvation, Healings, signs and wonders: For many to be saved, healed and delivered.

- Weather: Fine weather during the mission week would help! As the season for planting crops is almost on us, please pray that people will not be hindered from attending.

- Addictions: For many to be set free from alcohol addiction.

- **Pray for unity in the team:** Because, unusually for us, this is the region where many of our team live there is the potential of domestic issues proving a distraction. Pray too for unity between the pastors to be greatly enhanced.

- **Protection**: For the spiritual and physical protection both of the team and their families

- Nurture: For every soul that has been touched by the Lord to be properly nurtured and discipled.

That Daniel's own presence (see above) will in no way prove an obstacle to God's plans.

Thank you so much for all your amazing prayer, encouragement and support. None of this work would be possible without it.
