## Urgent Call to Prayer. Posters pulled down, Church set on fire and Team unwell: May God break through in power!

Next week's mission (20th -27th January) takes place in Kalungu, a rural

area on the Equator, eighty miles south west of Kampala. Prayer is essential!

## Don't be fooled!

It may look idyllic, but as you dig below the surface, you find that *Kalungu* has one of

the highest rates of HIV/ AIDS in Uganda. This has left many orphans in its wake. Drunkenness and witchcraft are also rife. There is a strong Catholic presence, but sadly many of these local Catholics are bitterly opposed to any form of "born again" outreaches. Any Catholic who is converted in an outreach is likely to be promptly chased out of the village.

In the last few days our posters have been pulled down and ripped up. The leader of the local intercessory team for the mission was also horrified to find her church building set ablaze.
